SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE SHOW

- 1 Classes are open to all comers except where specifically stated otherwise.
- 2 The entry fee is 25p per exhibit for the adult classes and 10p per exhibit for the children's classes.
- 3 An exhibitor may make two entries in any class, but may win only one prize in a class. In the horticultural classes two exhibitors from the same address may only win one prize in a class.
- 4 Entry form and fees are to be in the hands of one of the following people by 9 pm on the Wednesday preceding the Show:

- 5 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Show Secretaries until 5.30pm on the Thursday prior to the Show. No late entries will be accepted on Show Day.
- 6 All exhibits in the horticultural section must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least two months. Exhibits in other sections must be the exhibitor's own work. Floral Art material may be purchased. In the photographic section entries must not have been shown in a previous show at Nailsea and must have been taken by the exhibitor.
- 7 Judging will be done to the relevant rules of the Societies to which the Society is affiliated.
- 8 In horticultural classes judges will recognise correct naming as telling in favour of an exhibit in close competition.
- 9 Any protest to an exhibit must be made in writing and accompanied by a fee of £1.00 before 2.00 pm on the day of the Show. The fee will be returned in the event of the protest being upheld.
- 10 The Society will take reasonable care of the property of exhibitors but will not accept responsibility for any loss or damage. The Society reserves the right to move any exhibit to assist display.
- 11 No exhibit shall be removed from the hall until 5.30 pm without permission from the Show Secretaries. Any not removed by 6.00 pm may be disposed of by the Show Secretaries.
- 12 Prize money not claimed within 7 days of the show will be forfeited and returned to the Society's funds.
- 13 The Society reserves the right to view any exhibitor's gardens or exhibits either before or after the show.
- 14 In the Daffodil section miniature and intermediate varieties must be from the approved lists of the Daffodil Society.
- 15 Most Points Trophies. The winner will be the exhibitor with most points in the appropriate set of classes. In the event of a tie, the winner is the one with more first prizes than the other(s); if there is still a tie the winner is the one with more second prizes than the other(s). If however there are two or more contenders with an equal number of first, second and third prizes, then the trophy will be shared.
- 16 Any competitor failing to comply with these regulations may be disqualified from taking any prize whatsoever. All matters not provided for in these regulations shall be left to the decision of the Show Secretaries whose decision shall be final.
- 17 The placing of an entry is regarded as acceptance of the above show regulations.

RECIPE FOR FRUIT LOAF, CLASS 93

4oz margarine; 4oz caster sugar; 2 eggs, size 3; ¼ pt milk less 2tblsp; 12oz mixed fruit; 8oz SR flour; 1 level tsp mixed spice; walnut halves. Sieve dry ingredients together. Place all ingredients into a mixing bowl except the walnuts. Beat until well mixed - 2 to 3 minutes. Place in a greased and bottom lined 2lb loaf tin. Smooth top, place on walnut halves. Bake in oven 325°F or Gas 3 middle shelf for 1½ to 1¾ hours. Leave in tin for 10 mins. Turn out and cool on a wire tray.

RECIPE FOR VICTORIA SANDWICH, CLASS 98

6oz margarine; 6oz caster sugar; 6oz SR flour; 3 eggs. Jam for filling. Caster sugar for sprinkling on top. Baked in two 7" (175mm) sandwich tins. Bake in oven 350°F or Gas 4 for 20 - 25 minutes. ½ " tolerance allowed in all tin sizes.
